

Taking climate action in your work

What are we doing?

This is an exercise to help gather some ideas for how you can take climate action in your work or projects. It's an opportunity to explore some of the challenges you might face doing this and work together in the group to think about solutions to these. It's an opportunity to share knowledge, ideas and experiences with each other!

Instructions

People: everyone at the event! This may be chaotic, but feel free to get stuck in and go for it!

Length: 20 minutes

Steps:

1. Use the learnings from the talks today to think up some ideas for how you can take climate action in your work. Use the sticky notes to place them under the 'ideas' heading. Do the same for challenges and solutions.
2. Feel free to tell us about where you might have experience of talking climate action in your work and share that knowledge with others. Your post it could say: 'We recently removed disposable cups from our office Café in HES, happy to share details' - we will be happy to link people up after the event!

Board rules:

- This is a safe space for participants to feel secure in being transparent, don't call out anything that anyone has added.
- Be kind and considerate. And be positive!
