The Linlithgow Peel and Loch Amendment Regulations 1978

Laid before Parliament in draft

Made	28 th April 1978
Coming into Operation	1 st May 1978

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 2 of the Park Regulation (Amendment) Act 1926(a) as read with the Ministry of Works (Transfer of Powers) (no. 1) Order 1945(b), the Minister of Works (Change of style and Title) Order 1962(c) and the Transfer of Functions (Scottish Royal Parks and Ancient Monuments) Order 1969(d) and all of the other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following regulations a Draft whereof has been laid before Parliament in accordance with section 2 (2) of the said Act as read with section 6(2) of the Statutory Instruments Act 1946(e).

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Linlithgow Peel and Loch Regulations 1978 and shall come into operation on 1st May 1978.

Interpretation

2.- (1) In these regulations:-

“the principal regulations” means Linlithgow Peel and Loch Regulations 1971(f).

“deposited plan” means the plan prepared in triplicate, sealed with the seal of the Secretary of State For Scotland and marked “The Linlithgow Peel and Loch Amendment Regulations 1978” copies of which are deposited at the offices of the Scottish Development Department, New St Andrews House, Edinburgh, Lothian Regional Council and West Lothian District Council, respectively.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(g) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations and the principal regulations as it applied for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if these regulations and the regulations hereby amended were Acts of Parliament.

Amendment of principal regulations

3. In regulation 2(1) of the principal regulations the definition of “the Park” shall be deleted and the following definition substituted:-

“the Park” means Linlithgow Peel and Loch, the footpath on the south side of the Loch extending from the South-West boundary of the Peel to the South-East boundary of Lady Park, that area of land extending to 4.365 hectares lying

Between the South side of the Edinburgh to Stirling Motorway (M9) And the North shore of Linlithgow Loch, and that area of land extending to 3.735 hectares lying to the east of Loch known as “Fiddler’s Croft” which area is shown coloured pink and delineated in black on the deposited plan.
