Good to know

Fort George is an active military base. You may see soldiers at work and military vehicles during your visit. You are also likely to hear noise from the nearby firing ranges. Some of the buildings are used by the army and are not open to the public and for security reasons there may be armed sentries and staff may ask to search your bags.

Fort George has many sudden drops: please take care. Visitors must not climb on the ramparts, outer walls or cannons. If you hear an alarm please make your way to the parade ground (no. 5 on the visitor map) where staff will give you further instructions. Military vehicles and staff cars are permitted in the fort – please watch out for these.
