Arrangements for group travel

The nearest parking is at Glen Bridge Coach Park, Chalmers Street. Two coach drop-off spaces are available on St Margaret's Street but these cannot be used for parking. There is no parking at the abbey.

You can borrow sit mats for use in the Abbey nave, subject to availability. We can provide printed kids' quizzes and stickers. There is an interactive 3D Abbey model. We have an Abbey themed handling box available to borrow – please contact us in advance to arrange.



Space to leave bags

There is no space at the Abbey for bags to be stored during your visit.



Spaces for lunch, learning or additional support

Pittencrieff Park (next to the abbey) is a popular picnic spot for groups. There is no seating available at Dunfermline Abbey and Palace.

There is no separate space at the Abbey that could be used for learners with additional support needs.

We have a shared education room with Dunfermline Carnegie Library and Galleries (DCLG) that can be used for free for bag drop off, lunch or schools own activity provided schools build in time to engage with the libraries and galleries. It is booked separately through DCLG Supervisors 01383 602365. Disabled access can be arranged.



Shop

Learning group members are very welcome to visit our shop. To keep queues manageable we suggest that only five learning group members visit the shop at one time.



Toilets

There are no toilets at Dunfermline Abbey and Palace. The nearest public toilets are located in the Dunfermline Carnegie Library and Galleries.
